Although we had originally twelve canoes booked to participate on Wednesday, the 29th, they were unable to go out and only three turned up on the rescheduled day, Thursday. One canoe eventually landed seven dolphins and one barracuda with a total weight of 76lbs and one brought in three barracudas and one dolphin with a total weight of 28lbs. Both Deputy and Marlin Madness however each had a strike but lost them.

Day 2 was very similar to day one in quietness although the weather was much better than the day before. Three boats, Shalako, Marlin Mania and Persistence released one



marlin each but our star for the day was seven-yearold Onam Benitez, angler on Deputy who landed an 18lb tuna.





Day 3 and final day of the tournament, was a very beautiful day. The sun was shining, the water was warmer and we were optimistic for the tournament.





We however were only

doing a half day of fishing from 6:30am to 2:00pm as our boat owners and anglers who came from all over Jamaica had to return home. This once again started as a very quiet day. Courtney Wilkinson on Persistence once again hooked and released a marlin as they did previously and Paulette Hossman landed an 18lb barracuda on the boat Keepin it Jiggy.

Whilst the big boats were off the dock, we had the 13th Annual David Charley Kiddies Tournament. Fourteen kids of different ages took part with the youngest angler being age 1 ¾ yrs. Quite a number of fish of different sizes were hooked, measured and released. We would like to thank the following persons for all the assistance they gave for this event. s **David Charley**, who made sure all the lines and hooks were ready, **Scott Stanley**, for supplying the
